Brush Cutting Workday



Are you interested in plant management on state natural areas? Come and help out at Kettle Moraine Oak Opening State Natural Area near Whitewater by becoming a part of the growing volunteer component of the State Natural Area Program.

Kettle Moraine Oak Opening is a diverse site with a mix of oak woods, savanna, and hill prairie. We are working on restoring a hill prairie (expect some terrain) that was lost to brush. We will be cutting and piling brush on Saturday, November 16th from 9am to noon. We have locally collected seed to spread on areas that are cleared. No skills needed you will be trained onsite.

Date: November 16th, 2013

Time: 9am-noon

Directions: From Whitewater take Hwy 12 east to Co. Hwy H. Turn left (north) on Co. Hwy H to Bluff Rd. Turn right (east) on Bluff to the grassy parking area on the left shortly after turning on Bluff Rd.

What to wear: Clothes that are OK to get beat up, gloves, sturdy footwear.

What to bring: Drinking water, loppers for cutting brush (optional), energy.

If the workday is cancelled due to weather conditions, a message will be left at 608-228-4349 at least two hours prior to the event. If there is no cancellation message, the workday will continue as scheduled.
